Class 1	SSA EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIPS OPEN QUALIFYING CLASS Winner to be presented with the Edward Willes Perpetual Memorial Trophy however this trophy is held by the Society and the winner will receive a memento.
Class 2	SSA CLASSICAL LADIES SIDE-SADDLE QUALIFYING CLASS
Class 3	RIDING CLUB HORSE OR PONY SIDE SADDLE
Class 4	CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE
	CHAMPIONSHIP All 1 st and 2 nd prize winners from classes 1-4 are eligible to compete. Champion - £100 Reserve - £50
Class 5	COSTUME CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE – This class will not commence before 2pm.

Class 1 - The SSA EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIPS OPEN QUALIFYING CLASS

Run under SSA Rules defined in the current Member's Handbook. Open to SSA Members and Non-Members. Members carrying their current Championship Points Cards are eligible for SSA rosettes to 3rd Adult and 3rd Junior places and SSA Championship Points. **Southernden Farm** offers a rosette to the highest placed Member aged under 14 on 1st January of the current year. **Side Saddle International** offer a rosette to the Adult Member and **Manor Grange Stud Show Centre** to the Junior Member, judged to be the best turned out. Juniors must wear Hats to current Safety Standard or above.

Class 2 - The SSA CLASSICAL LADIES SIDE SADDLE QUALIFYING CLASS

Open to SSA Adult Members and Non-members, aged 18 and over on January 1st of the current year, riding side saddle, on horses exceeding 148cm (14.2hh). To be judged 25% conformation and action, 25% manners & way of going, 25% rider, and 25% turnout of horse & rider, by a SHBGB, BSHA, BSPS, P(UK) or SSA Panel Judge. Judges may request a short show, but will not ride exhibits; horses will not be stripped. Traditional habits must be worn. Fancy Dress and Period Costumes NOT permitted. **NB** Silk hats are permitted to be worn in this class AT ANY TIME OF THE DAY. Judges are requested to use the mark sheet provided. The highest placed horse/rider combination qualifies for the Final to be held at the National Side Saddle Show. In the event of previous qualification, this may be passed down to fourth place. **Special rosettes** are offered by **Mrs T Mitchell** to the winner and if the winner has already qualified, a second rosette is awarded with the Qualification Card. Qualifying combinations are required to become Full Members of the

SSA 21 days prior to the National Side Saddle Show or as soon as possible if qualified after that date to be eligible to be eligible to compete at the Final. Combinations qualifying between one National Side Saddle Show and the next may carry forward the qualification, for that year only.

The highest placed **Riding Horse, Hack** (not exceed 160cm), **Cob** or **Hunter**, Mare or Gelding, 4 years and over, ridden by a SSA Adult Member qualifies for the current year's **BSHA Championship Show DMSL Phone Systems Ladies Show Horse Championship** and if already qualified the ticket will go to the next highest placed horse down to 5th place. Combinations qualifying after the current year's BSHA Championship Show may carry forward the qualification, to the following year. **SSA Members** who qualify for **The Ladies Show Horse Championship**, will not be required to join the BSHA in order to compete in any **Side Saddle class** at the **BSHA National Championship Show**. If the BSHA Championship Show entries have closed at the time of qualification, competitors will not be charged a late entry fee for the **Championship**.

Class 3 - SIDE SADDLE RIDING CLUB HORSE/PONY OPEN CLASS

Open to horses and ponies 4 years old or over. Riders will be required to give a short show including a small jump, maximum 61cm (2'). The height may be adjusted during the course of the class at the Judge's discretion. The class shall be judged on the show, the manners of horse/pony and its suitability for the rider. Conformation will not be considered. A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Cards. Hats to current Safety Standard or above must be worn.

Class 4 - SIDE SADDLE CONCOURS d'ÉLÉGANCE

The sole criterion for this class is the elegance of the picture presented by horse and rider. Attention may be paid to the rider's personal appearance but detailed inspection of rider or tack is not required. Fancy dress or period costume is not permitted. Competitors are required to walk, trot and canter. No individual show is required, but the Judge may ask groups of 3 or 4 riders to give short displays. A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Cards. **N.B.** Silk hats are permitted to be worn by Adults IN THIS CLASS AT ANY TIME OF DAY. Juniors **must** wear hats to current Safety standards or above for this class. Adult riders not wearing such hats do so at their own risk.

Class 5 - COSTUME SIDE SADDLE CONCOURS d'ÉLÉGANCE

The sole criterion for this class is the elegance of the picture presented by horse/pony and rider, and the way of going of the horse/pony. Safe tack must be used. Detailed inspection of the rider's period costume is not required. Fancy dress is not permitted. Competitors are required to walk, trot and canter. No individual show is required, but the judge may ask small groups of 3 or 4 riders to give short displays. A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Card. Competitors should produce a brief résumé about their costumes for the Commentator. Juniors **must** wear hats to current Safety Standard or above for this class. Adult riders not wearing such hats do so at their own risk.

PLEASE NOTE THAT A HORSEBOX PASS WILL ADMIT ALL SEATED OCCUPANTS. ANY HORSEBOXES/TRAILERS NOT DISPLAYING A PASS WILL BE CHARGED ON THE DAY ADMISSION CHARGE

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. **Disclaimer of Liability.** In this clause the term Exhibitor shall include persons taking part in any competition or display arranged by the Show Committee and the owner of any animal, plant machinery or other thing involved in any such competition or display or otherwise exhibited on the showground. Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Committee, its servants or agents, the committee will not be responsible for death, injury, disease, damage or loss caused to any exhibitor or to his or her servant or agent or to any animal, article, plant, machinery or thing of whatever nature brought on to the showground by the said exhibitor from whatever cause death, injury, disease, damage or loss arises.

(Save as aforesaid) the exhibitor shall indemnify the committee against all claims, damages and expenses whatsoever in any way arising out of the presence of the exhibitor, his servants, agents, exhibits, vehicles or equipment on the showground and shall assume full responsibility therefore.

Acceptance of the foregoing provisions shall be a condition of entry.

Exhibitors are advised to insure against fire and other appropriate risk not only as regards their own property but also against any third party claim.

Entry to the show is by ticket and every ticket is issued on the understanding that the person to whom the ticket is issued is on the showground entirely at their own risk and must have deemed to take the Showground and thereon as he finds it. He shall not have, or make, any claim for injury or damage against Market Bosworth Agricultural, Horticultural and Equestrian society or its respective Officers, Agents or workmen; however such injury or damage shall be caused.

2. Entries

- ◆ All entries must be made on the Official Entry forms together with the full entry fees.
- ◆ Cheques should be crossed and made payable to: Market Bosworth Show
- No telephone or late entries will be accepted
- The Council of the Society reserves the right to refuse entry.
- Reduced entry fees for Members relate to fully paid up Members of the Market Bosworth Agricultural, Horticultural and Equestrian Society.

3. Conditions of Entry

- ◆ The numbers that each Competitor receives from the Secretary must be worn in a conspicuous place. Numbers will not be issued until all fees are paid and duplicate numbers will not be issued at any time.
- ◆ No substitution of Exhibits is permitted.
- ◆ No person who shall have been shown to the satisfaction of the Council to have been excluded from exhibiting for prizes at shows, sales or exhibitions or any other Breed or Agricultural society, Association or Club and no person who is under exclusion or suspension from any Breed Society or Agricultural Society, Association or club shall be allowed to exhibit at this or any other Show or society.
- ♦ Competitors may be disqualified from any Class for not observing the Rules or causing unnecessary delay to the continuity of the Show.

4. Judging

- ◆ The Council reserves the right to vary or add to the panel of Judges as it is deemed necessary.
- ♦ A Judge may withhold any prize if, in his opinion, an exhibit is of insufficient merit.
- ◆ If there are not more than three entries in a Class it is left to the discretion of the Judge and Stewards to withhold the First and other prizes should the quality of entries not justify a prize.

- ◆ Where there is doubt regarding the age of a Competitor, they must be prepared to produce a Birth Certificate.
- ◆ Where the height of a horse or pony is specified in any Class, the Steward, Official or Judge may require such an animal to be measured by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon unless the animal has an official measurement certificate issued by the Joint Measurement Board. ½" will be allowed for normal shoes.
- ◆ No person may deliberately and knowingly enter and show an equine under a Judge who is known to have bred, sold or produced that animal or have a pecuniary interest.
- ◆ The judges decision is final
- 5. **Objections** must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of £100 and handed to the Secretary within thirty minutes of the finish of the event concerned.

6. Prize-winners

◆ Prize money will be paid out at the Treasurer's Caravan/Tent. Prize money not collected on the show Day will be forfeited and donated to the Charity suggested by the Society.

7. **Health & Safety**

- ◆ Headgear meeting current Safety Standards must be worn by Junior riders in all classes and by all riders in specified classes and should be properly fastened. Adult competitors wear alternative headgear at their own risk.
- ◆ All dogs must be kept on a lead and under proper control at all times
- ◆ No animal suffering from a contagious disease may be brought onto the Showground.
- ♦ In the event of an Honorary Veterinary Surgeon advising the removal of any animal from the showground his decision shall be immediately complied with.

8. Parking

- ♦ Exhibitors Vehicles. All vehicles must be parked at the places provided or as directed by the parking attendants.
- Persons are admitted entry to the show car parks at their own risk and vehicles and their accessories and contents are admitted to and left in the car parks at the owner's risk, and while every endeavour is taken to ensure the safety thereof, the committee will not (save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the committee, its servants, or agents) be responsible for personal injury (whether fatal or otherwise) loss of damage to property and any other loss, damage, costs and expenses howsoever caused.
