Class 1 – Restricted Novice Ridden – Snaffle Bridles Only – Combination to have not won 2 x 1st Places in Ridden Classes in 2017 – Walk & Trot Only. Open to all combinations that fit the criteria stated.

Class 2 – First Year Ridden - Snaffle Bridles Only – Horse or Pony to be in its First year of Ridden competition. Walk & Trot Only. Horse or Pony Any Age 4yrs +. Open to all that fit the criteria stated.

Class 3 – Novice Rider Class – Snaffle Bridles Only – Rider to be a Novice, Any Age and not to have won 3 x 1st places in Ridden Classes. Walk Trot Only.

Class 4 – Novice / Green Horse or Pony Class – Snaffle Bridles Only, Combination not to have won 4 x 1st places in Open Classes, Walk, Trot and Optional Canter in Individual Class.

COMPETITION RULES FALLS: A fall of horse/pony or rider in any class run under Side Saddle Association rules will result in disqualification, and the rider must leave the ring dismounted. It is strongly recommended that medical advice is then sought before competing in any other class. JUNIOR COMPETITORS (SSA Members or Non SSA Members): MUST have attained their 5th birthday and be under 18 on 1st January of the current year and MUST wear a correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hat that meets one of the following current Safety Standards in all classes affiliated to or run by the SSA: All PAS 015; VG1; (BS) EN1384 2017; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; SNELL E2016; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards. A Spur or Spur band is not permitted in any class where jumping is involved. ADULT COMPETITORS (SSA Members or Non SSA Members): MUST be aged 18 or over on 1st January of the current year and MUST wear a correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hat that meets one of the following current Safety Standards where indicated in the competition rules: All PAS 015; VG1 ; (BS) EN1384 2017; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; SNELL E2016; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards. Where safety hats are not compulsory, Adult competitors wear alternative headgear at their own risk. LEAD REIN competitors MUST compete Hors Concours in any SSA affiliated class unless otherwise stated. QUALIFIERS: Shows held up to and including the first day of the 2018 National Side Saddle Show will be Qualifiers for 2018. Shows held after that date will be Qualifiers for the following year.

CLASS 26 YOUNG RIDERS SIDE SADDLE Ponies not to exceed 138cm (13.2hh). Open to riders aged between 5 and 10 years on January 1st of the current year. Spurs are not permitted. Riders need not wear habits. Lead rein permitted. No cantering is allowed except for individual performances.

Class 27 SIDE SADDLE INTERNATIONAL NOVICE SIDE SADDLE EQUITATION Open to novice riders (those who have never competed in a SSA Equitation qualifying class) and is open to S.S.A Members and non-members. A short simple show will be required, and only in walk and trot. Lead rein riders welcome. The wearing of a habit is optional. Juniors must wear hats to the current British Safety Standard. Riders may share a horse/pony. Rosettes will be awarded to the 4 highest placed SSA members carrying their current Membership card.

Class 28 SIDE SADDLE CONCOURS d'ELEGANCE The sole criteria for this class is the elegance of the picture presented by horse and rider. Attention may be paid to the rider's personal appearance but detailed inspection of rider or tack is not required. Fancy dress or period costume is not permitted. Competitors are required to walk, trot and canter. No individual show is required, but the Judge may ask small groups of three or four riders to give short displays. 4 special rosettes will be awarded: to the highest placed adult wearing a silk hat, bowler hat, and safety hat and the highest placed Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points card. NB Silk hats are permitted to be worn by Adults in this class at any time of the day. Junior riders must wear hats to current British Safety Standards or above for this class. Adult riders not wearing such hats do so at their own risk.

Class 29 EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIPS OPEN QUALIFYING CLASS Run under SSA Rules defined in the current Member's Handbook. Open to SSA Members and Non-Members. Members carrying their current Championship Points Cards are eligible for SSA rosettes to 3rd Adult and 3rd Junior places and SSA Championship Points. Southernden Farm offers a rosette to the highest placed Member aged under 14 on 1st January of the current year. Side Saddle International offer a rosette to the Adult Member and Manor Grange Stud Show Centre to the Junior Member, judged to be the best turned out. Juniors must wear Hats to current Safety Standard or above

Class 30 BEST HORSE OR PONY RIDDEN SIDE SADDLE Open to horses and ponies 4 years old or over: conformation & manners will be taken into consideration; horses/ponies will not be stripped. A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Cards. The Highest placed coloured exhibit (who has not already qualified) receives a Special Rosette and qualifies for the Side Saddle Final at the CHAPS Championship Show. Open to any type of exhibit. Riders must be 16 or over. Riders/Owners need not be a member or their exhibit registered with CHAPS at the time of qualification, but in order to compete at the Championships, the Rider/Owner must be a showing member and their horse/pony registered with CHAPS before entering the final.

Class 31 CLASSICAL LADIES HORSE SIDE SADDLE CLASS Open SSA members and Non-members aged 18 and over riding side saddle on a horse exceeding 148cms. To be Judged 25% conformation, 25% manners and way of going, 25% rider and 25% turnout of horse and rider by a SHBGB, BSHA, BSPS, P(UK) OR SSA Panel judge. Judges may request a short show, but will not ride exhibits, horses will not be stripped. Traditional Habits must be worn; Fancy dress or period costume is Not permitted. Silk hats are permitted to be worn in this class at any time of the day. Judges are requested to use the mark sheet provided. The highest placed horse/rider combination qualifies for the Final to be held at the National Side Saddle Show. In the event of previous qualification, this may be passed down to fourth place. Special rosettes are offered by Mrs T Mitchell to the winner and if the winner has already qualified, award a second rosette with the qualification card. Qualifying combinations are required to become members of the SSA 21 days prior to the National Show to be eligible to compete at the Final. The highest placed Riding Horse Hack (exceeding 148 cms not exceeding 160cms or Cob or Hunter, mare or gelding, 4 years or over, ridden by an S.S.A Adult member qualifies for the 2015 BSHA Championship Show Total Impact Equestrian Ladies Show Horse Championship and if already qualified the ticket will go to the next highest placed horse down to 5th place.

ADULT COMPETITORS (SSA Members or Non SSA Members): MUST be aged 18 or over on 1st January of the current year and MUST wear a correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hat that meets one of the following current Safety Standards where indicated in the competition rules: All PAS 015; VG1 ; (BS) EN1384 2017; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; SNELL E2016; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards. Where safety hats are not compulsory, Adult competitors wear alternative headgear at their own risk. LEAD REIN competitors MUST compete Hors Concours in any SSA affiliated class unless otherwise stated. QUALIFIERS: Shows held up to and including the first day of the 2018 National Side Saddle Show will be Qualifiers for 2018. Shows held after that date will be Qualifiers for the following year.

The highest placed Riding Horse Hack (exceeding 148 cms not exceeding 160cms or Cob or Hunter, mare or gelding, 4 years or over, ridden by an S.S.A Adult member qualifies for the 2015 BSHA Championship Show Total Impact Equestrian Ladies Show Horse Championship and if already qualified the ticket will go to the next highest placed horse down to 5th place.

Class 36 – In Hand Show Pony / Show Hunter Pony/ Part Bred Pony Not exceeding 14.2hh (15hh in the case of SHP)

Class 37 – In Hand Traditional Cob/ Vanner/ Native Type (Non M & M) Shown in Full Hair

Class 38 – In Hand Other Type – Pure Bred or Such as Rare and Unusual/ Foreign Breeds or Palomino/ Cremello & Spotted - Not Catered for within Classes 30, 31, 33, 34, 35, 37 (unless American Bred) – Please Check if Unsure – No M & M or Continental Warm Bloods.

Class 39 – In Hand Miniature Horse Not Exceeding 42"

Class 40 – Young Handlers – 16years & Under - Will Split Class If Needed to Under 11yrs & 12 – 16 as Needed.

Class 41 – In Hand Concours D Elegance – Hard Hats to Be Worn by Under 18yrs

Class 42 – Youngstock 1,2,3 Years Old – Any Type – Award to Best Yearling, 2yo & 3yo

Class 43 – In Hand Open Horses Exceeding 14.2hh Any Type Any Age

Class 44 – In Hand Open Ponies Not Exceeding 14.2hh Any Type Any Age

Championship 6 – In Hand Championship 1st & 2nd From Classes 32 – 44

Side Saddle Section Affiliated to the Side Saddle Association

COMPETITION RULES FALLS: A fall of horse/pony or rider in any class run under Side Saddle Association rules will result in disqualification, and the rider must leave the ring dismounted. It is strongly recommended that medical advice is then sought before competing in any other class. JUNIOR COMPETITORS (SSA Members or Non SSA Members): MUST have attained their 5th birthday and be under 18 on 1st January of the current year and MUST wear a correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hat that meets one of the following current Safety Standards in all classes affiliated to or run by the SSA: All PAS 015; VG1; (BS) EN1384 2017; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; SNELL E2016; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards. A Spur or Spur band is not permitted in any class where jumping is involved. ADULT COMPETITORS (SSA Members or Non SSA Members): MUST be aged 18 or over on 1st January of the current year and MUST wear a correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hat that meets one of the following current Safety Standards where indicated in the competition rules: All PAS 015; VG1 ; (BS) EN1384 2017; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; SNELL E2016; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards. Where safety hats are not compulsory, Adult competitors wear alternative headgear at their own risk. LEAD REIN competitors MUST compete Hors Concours in any SSA affiliated class unless otherwise stated. QUALIFIERS: Shows held up to and including the first day of the 2018 National Side Saddle Show will be Qualifiers for 2018. Shows held after that date will be Qualifiers for the following year.

CLASS 26 YOUNG RIDERS SIDE SADDLE Ponies not to exceed 138cm (13.2hh). Open to riders aged between 5 and 10 years on January 1st of the current year. Spurs are not permitted. Riders need not wear habits. Lead rein permitted. No cantering is allowed except for individual performances.

Class 27 SIDE SADDLE INTERNATIONAL NOVICE SIDE SADDLE EQUITATION Open to novice riders (those who have never competed in a SSA Equitation qualifying class) and is open to S.S.A Members and non-members. A short simple show will be required, and only in walk and trot. Lead rein riders welcome. The wearing of a habit is optional. Juniors must wear hats to the current British Safety Standard. Riders may share a horse/pony. Rosettes will be awarded to the 4 highest placed SSA members carrying their current Membership card.

Class 28 SIDE SADDLE CONCOURS d'ELEGANCE The sole criteria for this class is the elegance of the picture presented by horse and rider. Attention may be paid to the rider's personal appearance but detailed inspection of rider or tack is not required. Fancy dress or period costume is not permitted. Competitors are required to walk, trot and canter. No individual show is required, but the Judge may ask small groups of three or four riders to give short displays. 4 special rosettes will be awarded: to the highest placed adult wearing a silk hat, bowler hat, and safety hat and the highest placed Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points card. NB Silk hats are permitted to be worn by Adults in this class at any time of the day. Junior riders must wear hats to current British Safety Standards or above for this class. Adult riders not wearing such hats do so at their own risk.

Class 29 EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIPS OPEN QUALIFYING CLASS Run under SSA Rules defined in the current Member's Handbook. Open to SSA Members and Non-Members. Members carrying their current Championship Points Cards are eligible for SSA rosettes to 3rd Adult and 3rd Junior places and SSA Championship Points. Southernden Farm offers a rosette to the highest placed Member aged under 14 on 1st January of the current year. Side Saddle International offer a rosette to the Adult Member and Manor Grange Stud Show Centre to the Junior Member, judged to be the best turned out. Juniors must wear Hats to current Safety Standard or above

Class 30 BEST HORSE OR PONY RIDDEN SIDE SADDLE Open to horses and ponies 4 years old or over: conformation & manners will be taken into consideration; horses/ponies will not be stripped. A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Cards. The Highest placed coloured exhibit (who has not already qualified) receives a Special Rosette and qualifies for the Side Saddle Final at the CHAPS Championship Show. Open to any type of exhibit. Riders must be 16 or over. Riders/Owners need not be a member or their exhibit registered with CHAPS at the time of qualification, but in order to compete at the Championships, the Rider/Owner must be a showing member and their horse/pony registered with CHAPS before entering the final.

Class 31 CLASSICAL LADIES HORSE SIDE SADDLE CLASS Open SSA members and Non-members aged 18 and over riding side saddle on a horse exceeding 148cms. To be Judged 25% conformation, 25% manners and way of going, 25% rider and 25% turnout of horse and rider by a SHBGB, BSHA, BSPS, P(UK) OR SSA Panel judge. Judges may request a short show, but will not ride exhibits, horses will not be stripped. Traditional Habits must be worn; Fancy dress or period costume is Not permitted. Silk hats are permitted to be worn in this class at any time of the day. Judges are requested to use the mark sheet provided. The highest placed horse/rider combination qualifies for the Final to be held at the National Side Saddle Show. In the event of previous qualification, this may be passed down to fourth place. Special rosettes are offered by Mrs T Mitchell to the winner and if the winner has already qualified, award a second rosette with the qualification card. Qualifying combinations are required to become members of the SSA 21 days prior to the National Show to be eligible to compete at the Final. The highest placed Riding Horse Hack (exceeding 148 cms not exceeding 160cms or Cob or Hunter, mare or gelding, 4 years or over, ridden by an S.S.A Adult member qualifies for the 2015 BSHA Championship Show Total Impact Equestrian Ladies Show Horse Championship and if already qualified the ticket will go to the next highest placed horse down to 5th place.
