Affiliations & Qualifiers

This Show is affiliated to Equifest, taking place at the East of England Showground in **August 2019.** The **two** highest placed Exhibits not already qualified in classes will qualify.

- Class 106 is a qualifier for 12. EQUIFEST OPEN WORKING HUNTER
- Stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms. Riders of stallions to have attained their 14th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Maximum height of fences 1.14m (3'9") at the discretion of the Judges.
- Class 97 is a qualifier for 16. NUPAFEED / EQUIFEST RIDING HORSES
- Open Riding Horse, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, any height. Riders any age.
- Classes may be divided as follows: Small Riding Horses mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 158cms. Large Riding Horses - mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 158cms.
- Class 96 is a qualifier for 17. NUPAFEED / EQUIFEST RIDDEN COBS
- Open Ridden Cob, mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 155cms. Riders any age.
- Classes may be divided as follows: Open Lightweight Ridden Cob, mare or gelding, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 155cms. Open Heavyweight Ridden Cob, mare or gelding, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 155cms.
- And 18. FUTURE IMAGES LTD/ EQUIFEST MAXI COBS
- Open Maxi Cobs, mare or gelding 4 years old and over, exceeding 155cms to be judged as Cobs. Riders any age.
- · Class 100 is a qualifier for 19. BLACK COUNTRY SADDLES / EQUIFEST RIDDEN HUNTERS
- Open Ridden Hunter, mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 153cms. Riders any age.
- Classes may be divided as follows: Lightweight Hunter, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, capable of carrying up to 12.7 stone. Middleweight Hunter, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, capable of carrying 12.7 stone but not 14 stone. Heavyweight Hunter, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over capable of carrying over 14 stone.
- \bullet Class 98 is a qualifier for 22. BSPA / EQUIFEST RIDDEN PIEBALD / SKEWBALD
- Open ridden Piebald / Skewbald stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old & over. Riders any age. The first three places will also qualify for the BSPA Championship. Subject to their show rules & conditions. Classes may be divided according to entries.

The Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) will award Special Incentive Cards to the highest placed Irish Draught Pure Bred or Irish Draught Sport Horse in the Open Ridden Cob, Open Riding Horse, Novice Hunter, Ladies Hunter, Open Hunter, Working Show Horse (Cobs/Maxi/Riding Horses only), Novice Working Hunter and Open Working Hunter classes. To be eligible, exhibits must be registered with or over-stamped by the IDHS (GB) on either their Irish Draught Breed Registers or Irish Draught Sport Horse Registers.

Registration numbers to be stated on the entry form.

Affiliations & Qualifiers

Owners of pure-bred Irish Draughts must be full members of the IDHS(GB). This rule does not apply to owners of Irish Draught Sporthorses.

This show is a Qualifier for the Blue Chip & Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) £2,000 Challenge. The highest placed horse (not already qualified) from each of classes 96 (Open Ridden Cob), 97 (Open Riding Horse), 99 (Novice Hunter), 100 (Open Hunter), 109 (Working Show Horse - Cobs/Maxi/Riding Horses only), 110 (Novice Working Hunter) and 111 (Open Working Hunter) that is registered or eligible for registration on the Irish Draught or Irish Draught Sport Horse Registers, i.e. with a minimum of 25% proven Irish Draught breeding, will qualify for the Final of the Blue Chip & IDHS (GB) £2,000 Challenge. Horses need not be registered with the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) to qualify but must be on the IDHS (GB) Registers by the time of the Championship which will be held at the IDHS (GB) Annual Breed Show in 2020 (date and venue to be confirmed). N.B: A horse may only qualify for the Final once, regardless of the type or number of classes won, placed in or entered. Each qualifier will receive a card and a £10 voucher from Blue Chip. Qualifiers are required to complete an online form at www.idhsgb.com to inform the IDHS (GB) that they have qualified for the Final. In the Final, the Champion will be awarded £1,000 prize money, a trophy and a Blue Chip rug. The Reserve Champion will be awarded £500 and 3rd to 7th inclusive will be awarded £100 each. In addition, the highest placed Pure Bred Irish Draught will receive a trophy and £100, the highest placed 158cm (15.2hh) and under will receive a trophy and £50, the highest placed sport Horse will receive a trophy and £50 and the highest placed Amateur Produced and Ridden Horse will receive £50 a silver salver and a rug.

TSR Showing Finals

- This show is a qualifier for the 2019 TSR Showing Finals. Qualify and enter ANY of the Finals Central, East Anglia, North West, North East, South East, South, Wales & South West or Scottish. You Do Not have to be a TSR member to qualify or enter a final. The Rider/Handler qualifies and can enter any horse/pony in any number of Finals!

TSR Riders Finals

– 1st & 2nd riders qualify and will receive a qualification card in the ring.

BSHA Grass Roots Championships – With a TSR qualification flyer you can also enter the BSHA Grass Roots Champs on the 9th Sept at Addington Equestrian Centre – You do not have to be a BSHA member to qualify or enter the final. See http://www.britishshowhorse.org

CLASS 98 - RIDDEN COLOURED HORSE - Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms. Skewbald or piebald.

CLASS 99 - NOVICE HUNTER - Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms, not having won a first prize of £60 or a total of £200 (or equivalent values) in prize money in any Ridden Hunter Classes at home or abroad, before 1st January in the current year.

CLASS 102s - Best Shod Horse Awards - A competition sponsored by the Worshipful Company of Farriers, for the Best Shod Horse in the Ridden Horse Section, Classes 96 to 101. The Judge will examine each horse before or during the line-up for preliminary judging, taking into consideration:

- a) The condition of the feet
- b) The making (or preparation) and fitting of the shoes
- c) The nailing and position of clips

Normal shoes and showing plates are equally acceptable, provided they are suitable for the horse. The Worshipful Company of Farriers will award:

- · a Rosette and an Inscribed Card to the winner in each Class
- a Plaque to the overall winner
- a Plaque for the Registered Farrier responsible for its feet and shoeing

Winner to receive the Blacksmith's Workshop Perpetual Trophy.

CLASS 103

Side Saddle Concours D'elegance.

The sole criteria for this class is the elegance of the picture presented by horse and rider. Attention may be paid to the rider's personal appearance, but detailed inspection of rider or tack is not required. Fancy dress or period costume is not permitted. Competitors are required to walk, trot and canter. No individual show is required but the Judge may ask groups of three or four riders to give short displays. A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Card. NB: Silk hats are permitted to be worn by Adults in this class AT ANY TIME OF DAY. Winner to receive prizes in kind.

CLASS 104

Side Saddle Association Equitation Championships Open Qualifying class.

Run under SSA rules defined in the current Member's Handbook. Open to SSA Members and non-members. Members carrying their current Championship points card are eligible for SSA rosettes to 3rd Adult and 3rd Junior places and SSA Championship points. Southernden Farm offers a rosette to the highest placed member aged 14 and under on 1st January of the current year. A rosette in memory of The Late Mr R Philpot is offered to the Adult Member, judged to be the best turned out. Southernden Farm offers a rosette to the highest placed Member aged under 14 on 1st January of the current year. Manor Grange Stud Show Centre offer a rosette to the Junior Member, judged to be the best turned out. Hats to current Safety Standards or above must be worn by Junior riders. Winner to receive prizes in kind.

CLASS 105

Best Horse or Pony Ridden Side Saddle.

Open to horses and ponies 4 years old or over: conformation & manners will be taken into consideration; horses/ponies will not be stripped. A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Cards. Winner to receive prizes in kind.

The Highest placed **coloured exhibit** (who has not already qualified) receives a **Special Rosette** and qualifies for the Side Saddle Final at the **CHAPS Championship Show**. Open to any type of exhibit. Riders must be 16 or over. Riders/Owners need not be a member or their exhibit registered with CHAPS at the time of qualification, but in order to compete at the Championships, the Rider/Owner must be a showing member and their horse/pony registered with CHAPS before entering the final.

CLASS 107 - WORKING SHOW HORSE - Open to Hacks, Cobs/Maxi and Riding Horses, Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms. Minimum height 65cms, maximum height 85cms, maximum spread 85cms.

CLASS 108 - NOVICE WORKING HUNTER - kindly sponsored by Bede Events Limited

- Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms not to have won a total of £200, **excluding championship prize money**, (or equivalent values) in prize money in any Working Hunter Class, or more than 25 BE points or £200 BSJA Show jumping, at home or equivalent abroad before 1st January in the current year. Minimum height 75cms, maximum height 1.00m, maximum spread 92cms.

CLASS 109 - OPEN WORKING HUNTER - kindly sponsored by Flawborough Equine

- Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms. (14.2 hh). Grade A Show-jumpers and Advanced Event horses are not eligible to compete in these Classes. Any horse which has qualified as a Grade A Show Jumpers or Advanced Event Horses as at 1st January in the current year is not eligible to compete in Working Hunter classes. Minimum height 92cms, maximum height 110cms, maximum spread 114cms.

Heights of jumps may be altered at the Secretary's or Judge's discretion, to suit conditions on the day.

CLASS 110s - WORKING HUNTER CHAMPIONSHIP - kindly sponsored by Belvoir Equine

- 1st and 2nd prize winners from Classes 104 to 106 to compete for the Charles Bright Trophy, kindly donated by Consultancy Europe Associated Ltd in memory of Charles Bright.

The Champion and reserve will receive a sash.

Working Hunter Classes


Rules for Working Hunter

- Exhibitors may walk the course dismounted before their class.
- A rider can ride up to two horses in the Jumping Phase, but then must select only one
 horse to take forward into the Ride and Conformation Phase if so required, (no change
 of rider is allowed).
- Horses may be equipped with boots of a plain colour in the Jumping Phase only. No change of rider or tack will be allowed, (unless a horse is ridden under side-saddle, in which case, in order to allow the judge to ride, the saddle may be changed for the riding phase only).
- Any horse taking the wrong course or jumping another fence after completing the course will be eliminated.
- If a horse positively stops, ceases to go forwards at any time during its jumping round, or turns its quarters to a fence, or has a complete turnaround, these constitute refusals.
- The fall of horse and or rider anywhere on the course will result in elimination. The rider may not attempt another fence, but must leave the ring immediately on foot. First aid may be called first.
- Horses displaying continued disobedience, or horses leaving the ring whether mounted or dismounted will be eliminated.
- In the event of a tie in marks, the conformation mark will take precedence, followed by the ride mark, followed by the style mark. If there is still a tie, then the Judge's decision is final.

Phase 1 - Jumping phase - 40% actual jumping 20% style & presence whilst jumping

Phase 2 - Ride & Conformation - 20% conformation, movement and type 20% ride and manner

Penalties - 10 penalties - knockdown
15 penalties - 1st refusal
20 penalties - 2nd refusal
Elimination - 3rd refusal
Elimination - fall of horse/rider or error of course
